Florence Nightingale was a British nurse born in Florence, Italy, in 18202. She wanted to be a nurse, but her dad would not allow it as it was 'not a job for a lady'. She eventually became a nurse in 1853.

Edith Cavell was born in Norfolk, England, in 1865. She trained as a nurse becoming the leader of a training school in Belgium in 1907.





Key Vocabulary Allies Countries that fight together against other countries. In WW1 the allies were Britain, France, Russia and USA. Crimean War (1853 - 1856) A war between Russia on one side and Britain, France, Ottoman Empire (Turkey) and the Kingdom of Sardinia on the other. A person trained to care for the sick or infirm, Nurse especially in a hospital. Treason The crime of betraying your country to help the enemy. Treatment Medical care given to a patient for an illness or injury. Sentenced To decide and say officially what a punishment will be. WW1 (1914 - 1918) World War 1
